Retired General has Future Under Command

hat can you do with a general when he stops being a general?" Bing Crosby croons in the musical White Christmas. Well, if you're talking about retired Brigadier General Stewart Rodeheaver, then you have no cause for concern. General Rodeheaver does an excellent job of handling that matter himself, thank you.

Rodeheaver, born and raised in Forsyth, GA, was the first person in his family to graduate from high school and the first to ever attend college. Although his degree from Mercer University is in business management, his 38 year career in the U.S. Army opened up his world in an entirely different direction. While garnering dozens of awards, honors and medals in the military, Rodeheaver discovered his greatest talent was in training new recruits.

"We had to find a better way to teach young people because they don't learn like they used to," he said. "We surveyed young soldiers and discovered they learn better virtually, visually and interactively."

He began to focus on experimental techniques and added virtual and problem based learning to the standard Army training. For this he won several awards of excellence and also a request from the Army to further apply his techniques to educate students in the public schools and institutions of higher learning.

Upon retirement, Rodeheaver made use of that business degree and started his own company, ViziTech USA, a break-away technology company focusing in 3D, virtual, interactive and

What does "As Is" really mean?

he BBB regularly receives calls and complaints from consumers that purchase vehicles "as is" and want to take them back when a problem occurs. When a car is sold "as is", the car is sold in its current condition, which means the buyer accepts the car with all known and unknown problems at the time the car is purchased. So, if something goes wrong or breaks down after you purchase the car, the cost of any repairs is almost always the buyer's responsibility. Generally,

unless the dealer made a representation about the condition of the vehicle that he knew to be false, "as is" pretty much covers the dealer on any faults the car has.

Contrary to popular belief, there is no "cooling off" period when it comes to car purchases. Further, lemon laws do not apply to used automobiles and verbal promises made during the sales process are practically impossible to prove.

However, there is information that offers buyers some protection, and which is required by law to accompany every sale of a used car by a dealer. It is contained in the Federal Trade Commission's Buyer's Guide, which must tell you:

· whether the vehicle is being sold

"as is" or with a warranty;

- · what percentage of the repair costs a dealer will pay under the warranty;
- · that spoken promises are difficult to enforce;
 - · to get all promises in writing;
- · to keep the Buyer's Guide for reference after the sale;
- · a brief description of the major mechanical and electrical systems on the car, including some of the major problems you should look out for; and
- · a reminder to ask to have the car inspected by an independent mechanic before you buy.

Whenever you purchase a used car from a dealer, you should receive the original or an identical copy of the Buyer's Guide that appeared in the vehicle that you bought. The guide must reflect any changes in warranty coverage that you may have negotiated with the dealer. It also becomes a part of the sales contract, and overrides any contrary provisions that may be in the contract. If the dealer promises to repair the vehicle or cancel the sale if you're not satisfied, make sure the promise is written on the Buyer's Guide. If the promises are not written on the Buyers Guide, you will have a hard time getting the dealer to make good on his

Consult your copy of the Buyer's Guide to determine if the vehicle was in fact sold "as is." If the dealer failed to provide a Buyer's Guide or to indicate that the car was being sold "as is," with no warranty, you may have some recourse against the dealer.

The best rule when buying a used car is to take the car to a mechanic of your choosing, not one recommended by the dealer, to have a thorough inspection. What may seem like a waste of money and time now can end up saving you thousands if the mechanic finds a mechanical problem with the car.

Oakland Cemetery Tour... April 1st

n April 1st, Philadelphia
Winn Chapter, Daughters of the
American Revolution, visited the
renowned Oakland Cemetery in
Atlanta, GA. There were 14
Daughters, one HODAR (husband of
DAR), and two guests in attendance.
After a morning tour of the cemetery, lunch was enjoyed at the spirited Six Feet Under Restaurant, directly across from the cemetery.

City fathers purchased six acres in 1850 to be a public burial ground. Originally called Atlanta Graveyard or City Burial Place, Oakland was renamed in 1872. By then it had expanded to 48 acres, mainly due to pressures of the Civil War. By 1867 the cemetery reached its present size.

Oakland Cemetery is the final resting place for the rich and poor, famous and unknown. There are approximately 6,900 Confederate graves at the cemetery with some 3,000 Unknown Confederate Dead.

The Lion of Atlanta stands sentry to these unknown soldiers who were hastily buried during the war then reinterred at Oakland Cemetery. Some famous notables resting under the branches of magnificent dogwoods, magnolias and acres of daffodils in season are past Confederate generals, Georgia governors, Atlanta mayors, Pulitzer prize winning author Margaret Mitchell, golfing great Bobby Jones, co-founder of The Augusta National Golf Club, site of the Masters Golf Tournament in Augusta, GA and Franklin Garrett, Atlanta Historian--to name a few.

In 1976, Oakland Cemetery was placed on the National Register of Historic Places and the Historic Oakland Foundation was founded. The City and the Foundation have worked together to stabilize the cemetery and make it an attractive and inviting place for all Atlantans. The statuary and gardens at the lovingly maintained for all to enjoy.

augmented reality based training. With this new technology, learners wear special glasses and tap a computer screen with a special stylus which pulls the image out of the screen and into the air between the user and the computer. This technology has been proven by the National Science Foundation, NASA, US Army and Texas Instruments to increase test scores by 33% and retention to 100%. ViziTech USA now tops the nation in production and sales of enhanced 3D imaging for medical, educational, commercial and military technology.

In 2012, Rodeheaver was Georgia's technology "Entrepreneur of the Year" and ViziTech USA was the state's "Coolest Technology Company."

Honors for 2016 include Georgia's "Rock Star Small Business of the Year" and CIO Review's Top 20 Augmented Reality Development Companies in the Nation.

But beyond all those virtual ventures, Rodeheaver lives a pretty down-to earth life. He teaches a Sunday school class at his church and the local arts council asked him to join their board to employ his visual technology to help boost tourism for the City of Eatonton.

Taking Care

What to Look for in a New Home

s we advance in age, there is a good chance that eventually our home will no longer suit our lifestyle or our needs.

Common reasons for relocating include simplifying home ownership responsibilities, reducing living expenses, maximizing accessibility and safety, and increasing personally security,

community access or opportunities for activities and socializing.

There are many options for boomer and senior home ownership, including moving to a comparable-sized home with different design, downsizing to a smaller house or an apartment-style condominium, and moving to an adult lifestyle community containing detached homes or townhouses.

If you or a loved one are planning to relocate, it is important to consider not only your current needs and preferences but also potential future needs. By doing so you can maximize your chances of being able to age in place.

The following are some questions you may want to consider when checking out properties.

Building Features:

- · When was it built? Does it appear to be in good condition?
- Is the exterior maintenance-free?
- Is there an entrance at ground level? Is it sheltered?
- · If there are steps to enter, or to navigate once inside, is there plenty of landing space?
- Does the entrance door have a wideangle viewer (peephole)? Are door locks easy to operate?
- · Is there a sizeable foyer with room for a bench?
- . Is there a one-floor plan? If not, is there a kitchen, bathroom, bedroom and laundry room on the main floor? Is there an open concept layout?
- · Are hallways and doorways wide enough to accommodate a mobility device?
- · Is there non-slip flooring? Does carpet have a low pile?
- · Are there sturdy handrails on both sides of the stairs? Are steps deep enough to place the whole foot? Is the stair rise a comfortable height, and are risers closed? Are stairwells wide enough to accommodate a stair lift? Are they well lit?
- Is there a light switch within easy reach at the top and bottom?
- Is there an attached garage?
- Is there central air conditioning? A programmable thermostat?
- · Are there plenty of windows? Are they easy to operate? Energy efficient? Low enough to have a view while sit-
- Are door handles easy to operate? (A lever type is ideal.)
- Are light switches easy to reach from doorways?
- · Are there ample electrical outlets and phone jacks? What about high-speed
- · Are there smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors?

- . In the kitchen: Do countertops have rounded corners? Is there counter space next to appliances and cupboards?
- . In the bathroom: Are there grab bars in the tub? A hand-held showerhead? A walk-in shower? Built-in shower seat? Easy-to-handle faucets? (A single lever is best.)
- . Is there a spare bedroom and, ideally, a second bathroom, should live-in help be required?
- · If walls are shared with neighbors, what kind of soundproofing exists?

Apartment Considerations:

- Is the building fully air-conditioned?
- Are common areas spacious, clean and bright? Are furnishings and décor attractive and modern?
- Can elevators easily accommodate a wheelchair or scooter? Are the buttons easy to access?
- · Does every unit have a balcony or terrace?
- Are there in-suite laundry facilities? If not, is the laundry room easy to access? Are the appliances in good condition?

Grounds:

- Is the lot level?
- a If there is an entrance ramp, does it have a gentle incline?
- · Is there covered parking? Ample space for visitors' vehicles?
- · Are the grounds child-friendly for visiting grandchildren?
- · Does the neighborhood have side-

The Next Chapter

Book Recommendations by ANNE B. JONES, PhD

premier publishing company, Atlanta-based Peachtree Publishers, is well known for the quality of its children's books. Often containing powerful lessons, the stories are age-appropriate and compelling. Among the company's 2016 releases are The Sound of All Things, A Friend for Mole and Little One. Written by Myron Uhlberg and illustrated by Ted Papoulas, The Sound of All Things tells how a young boy attempts to describe sounds to his deaf parents, using gestures, demonstrations and sign language, One of the aspects I like about this unusual book is how it encourages children to think about and expand their word choices. The setting takes place in Brooklyn and in an amusement park on Coney Island. Uhlberg grew up with deaf parents in Brooklyn and the book reflects a sense of place. Papoulas' illustrations are as

exquisite as paintings with facial expressions and scenery rendered with expertise and fine detail.

A Friend for Mole by Nancy Armo was inspired by the author's son who observed "Everyone is scared of something, but friends can help." The book is simply written and illustrated and should appeal to toddlers who, like "Mole," become afraid when they're lost. After venturing from his burrow, Mole falls asleep and when he awakes it is night. He becomes frightened when he hears a rustling noise, but is relieved to discover a new friend, one who is also lost and who is scared of the dark. It's a tale of reaching out to others, cooperation and conquering fear.

Jo Weaver's Little One is a gentle book with lovely black and white pictures, a perfect bedtime choice. The story revolves around a mother bear and her cub who leave their den to go on an adventure to discover the outside world. Beginning in the springtime, their trek includes explorations reflective of the seasons. Among their activities are meeting new animal friends, catching fish, swimming in a forest lake and eating autumn berries. Weaver has an M.A. in children's book illustration from the Cambridge School of art. All three of these books make excellent gifts for children.

Switching to adult books, for this month, I've chosen an interdenominational Christian work. Deep in south metro is a lovely little book club made up of women who are members of a local Catholic Church. Through their reading they seek to learn to be a force for good in the world. Their selections reflect that goal and The Transformative

Power of Faith is among their best. Drawing heavily from Biblical references and parables, author Grayson Warren Brown tells inspirational stories giving powerful examples of love and faith. In addition to religious sources, he uses contemporary pop culture illustrations such as Star Wars and Major League Baseball, and personal experiences to drive his points home. Among the personalities he includes are Patch Adams and Leonard Bernstein. The work is a down-to-earth page-turner with easy-to-read short chapters filled with insight and humor. Brown is a personable and charismatic writer who is an internationally known liturgical composer and speaker. He began his liturgical ministry in a small multicultural parish in New York City during which time he learned the significance of an authentic spirit-filled experience of worship for those in

need.




