of purpose and productivity that accompany the early part of a new school year, ingrained in us from our youth and perhaps also from years

of raising children. As well, moderating temperatures typically result in an increase in our energy at this time of the year.

Homework that pays off

As a family caregiver, although you may not be returning to school, doing some homework in the coming weeks can pay off in terms of improving your well-being and that of the person you care for. Read on for suggestions.

Educate yourself about your relative's medical conditions and share the information with him or her and other family members as appropriate, to ensure you have a common understanding.

Request a medication review by your relative's primary physician or a geriatrician, to check for drug interactions and determine whether your relative still needs all of their prescriptions.

Arrange for an experienced lawyer to assist your relative in assigning powers of attorney for personal care and property (finances) and preparing a will. Or review such documents if they were done some time ago, to determine if they need updating.

Self-care strategies

Since self-care can improve your

effectiveness and longevity as a caregiver, consider the following strategies.


Book an appointment with your primary physician if you're overdue for a medical check-up or experiencing health issues.

Buy home fitness equipment or get some workout DVDs so you can exercise at home.

Do something that provides you with meaning and purpose apart from caregiving, to nurture your identity. Revive an old pastime or try something new.

If it's difficult for you to perform yard maintenance tasks or finding time is an issue, enlist the help of a

reliable neighbor (consider hiring a teenager from the block) or contract with a reputable yard maintenance service.

If your relative can be left alone, supply him or her with a portable phone and get yourself a cell phone so you can stay in touch as needed. An emergency response system is another valuable option.

If your relative cannot be left alone, research respite services in your community so you can take breaks from caregiving. It's a win-win arrangement: your relative will benefit from the added stimulation that comes from a visiting companion or meeting new people and trying new things at a program. In-home options include respite provided by home health-

care agency staff, an individual hired under a private arrangement and a trained volunteer (for example, from the Alzheimer's Association). There are also adult day care programs and residential care homes that have a short-stay program (so caregivers can take a vacation). To learn about resources, contact your local office on aging or the non-profit organization associated with your relative's disease.

Connect with other caregivers by joining a community support group; some offer concurrent care. Online caregiver message boards and chat rooms and electronic mailing lists or discussion forums are some at-home alternatives.



he Carl Vinson VA Medical
Center opened its drive-thru flu and
COVID-19 vaccine clinic today located
near the entrance of buildings 17 and 19 on
the main campus. Veterans can choose
whether they want one or both vaccines in
the one-stop shop clinic. The flu and
COVID-19 vaccines can be taken at the
same time as there are no adverse reactions
between vaccines.


The drive-thru flu vaccine clinic will operate Monday to Friday from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. This clinic provides convenience to Veterans who want to get their flu and/or COVID-19 vaccine without the need to schedule an appointment or enter the facility.

"Flu season is here and we're going to make it as easy as possible for Veterans to receive vaccines this year with our drivethru vaccine clinic," Jessica Hogan, Carl Vinson VAMC Vaccine Coordinator said. "Veterans drive up, present their VA identification card, and say if they want one or both of the vaccines – it's really that easy."

Veterans may also receive a flu shot during their next scheduled primary care, specialty care, or mental health appointment. Flu and COVID-19 vaccine clinics will be offered at the medical center's seven community-based outpatient clinics and notice will be provided via My HealtheVet, Facebook, and your local media outlets.

"Providing Veterans with easy access to vaccinations, especially against diseases affecting the respiratory system, is an important step in proactive healthcare," Carl Vinson VAMC Interim Medical Center Director Ronnie Smith. "We have a remarkably innovative team that streamlines processes, such as this drive-thru vaccine clinic, which gives Veterans a chance to receive the inoculation with very little time investment."

Veterans receiving the COVID-19 vaccine will have to pull into a designated parking are for approximately 15 minutes to be monitored for adverse reactions. Veterans receiving the flu vaccine do not have to wait and can proceed without delay.

BBB Scam Alert: Receive a text with a surprise offer? Don't click the link!

recently, BBB Scam Tracker has seen numerous reports of scammers impersonating well-known companies and offering discounts, some of which are COVID-19

How the Scam Works

themed.

You receive a text message from a large, reputable company. The message claims that, due to the pandemic, the company would like to help people out by offering them an amazing deal. These range from free or discounted services to gift cards and cash.

For example, many consumers report receiving the following text messages using this ploy:

- "COVID-19 REFUND. VERIZON COMPANY is giving out \$950 to all users of our Verizon service, If yes kindly text your Verizon"
- "Due to the pandemic, Hulu is giving everyone a free 1-year subscription to help you stay at home. Get yours here [link].
- "AT&T... Sorry for the coverage issues... Here's a little gift: [link]"

Other texts claim to be

Walmart, Amazon, Costco, USPS and others. Of course, these messages don't really originate with that company. They come from impersonators who hope to steal your personal information. If you click the link, you may be prompted to log into a lookalike website that scammers use to get hold of your login ID and password. With that information, scammers can access your accounts and even make purchases

using your saved payment methods.

While the latest BBB Scam
Tracker reports mention Hulu,
Netflix, and Verizon, watch out for
scammers impersonating other companies too. If one name stops being
effective, they'll quickly switch to
another company.

senders with caution. If you receive a message from a number you don't recognize, be careful. Many companies engage in SMS marketing, but keep in mind that consumers must opt in to receive messages. If you haven't given a company permission to text you, it's probably a scam.

- Don't click on links from strangers. Scammers often send shortened links that don't let you see where they really lead in the body of their text message. If you click the link, you could be directed to a dangerous website, or you could download malware onto your device.
- Confirm deals directly with the company before you accept. If you are really hoping the deal is legitimate, go to the company's official website and send them an email, or call to inquire. The company can let you know if the deal is real or not.
- Install antivirus software on your computer and mobile devices. This kind of scam can come from text messages or emails, so make sure all your electronics are protected. Antivirus software can scan for malware and alert you before you open a malicious website link.
- Alert the company. It will help them fight the problem. AT&T and Verizon are asking consumers to forward suspicious messages to 7726 (SPAM).



The inaugural dementia advocacy award has been named after and gifted to Robert Bowles, a retired local pharmacist and


to individuals and caretak-

BBB Tip: What to know before downloading a cashback app!

f you are looking for new ways to save money on daily purchases, latest trend isn't clipping coupons; it's cashback apps. By using apps such as Rakuten and Ibotta, shoppers can earn rewards, such as cash or gift cards, after making a purchase. But before you sign up for one or more of these apps, be sure to do your research.

How do Cashback Apps work?

Some cashback companies build relationships with stores and brands and receive a commission for purchases made through their apps and extensions. Then, they pass on a portion of the commission to the consumer. Other companies offer payouts based on accumulated points, which consumers can earn uploading receipts, purchasing specific products, or scanning products in store.

Many such apps and browser extensions are legitimate, but, as always, exercise caution when any company promises big rewards for minimal effort.

To find and use cashback apps safely, BBB recommends the following tips:

• Get to know the company behind the app or browser extension. Before you install a cashback program on your phone or browser, find out more about the company that runs it. Look the company up on BBB.org to see its business rating and read consumer reviews and complaints.

• Choose an app that fits your shopping patterns. The way apps reward consumers can vary. Some offer coupons or price comparisons to help you find the best deal. Passive cashback apps simply run in the background on your phone and track your purchases, giving you rebates when you shop at partner locations. Other apps reward you for shopping at specific retailers. Think about your shop-

ping habits as you choose an app or extension to score the most savings.

- Never pay a membership fee. You should never have to pay a fee to receive "free" money. Be wary of any app that claims to be free but asks you to pay a fee to receive a payout. Don't agree it could be a scam.
- Read the fine print. Most apps

require you sign up for a free membership before you can receive rebates. Read the fine print before you commit to make sure you understand what personal information you will need to share, how the app works, and how it tallies your purchases and rewards.

- Protect your privacy. Keeping in mind that since many cashback apps ask you to connect your credit card, debit card or bank account to receive rebates and make purchases, keeping your data safe is critical. Before sharing your sensitive information with any company, BBB and FTC suggest reviewing the company's privacy policy.
- Find out how payouts work. Nerd Wallet reminds consumers that payout methods can vary from company to

company. Do a little research to find out what the company's payout frequency and threshold is, as well as their payout method and qualifications.

• Avoid unnecessary spending. Take advantage of good deals on the products you need but remember that making unnecessary purchases just because you'll receive points or modest cashback bonuses will not save you money in the long run. In addition, when taking advantage of a product-specific deal, The Penny Hoarder advises, "Read the offer's fine print. Make sure you're purchasing the correct brand and quantity." If you purchase the wrong size or flavor product for example, the offer may not be valid.
