Our thanks go out to our partners at HomeAid Georgia for joining us in this effort and for introducing us to the Clayton County Community Services Authority."

Cornett explained the company had found an ideal partner this year in <u>Clayton County Community Services Authority</u>. In 2024 alone, the organization distributed more than 14,000 pounds of food to nearly 900 families – easing food insecurity and reducing financial strain on families in Clayton, Fayette, and Henry Counties.
